Read a variety of texts: -
Non-fiction
Fiction

Poetry

If you do not have any books, have a look on the internet or a newspaper, leaflet etc.

Explain to at someone at home what you thought of the book. Did you learn anything new? Record your answers or act out your thoughts. Maybe you could do a play about what you have read.



Small world

Retell a story about the sea. This could be about a boat, what's under the sea, and adventure etc.

Can you use the word of the day in your story? Make sure your story has a beginning, a middle and an end. Can you use a time connective in your story?



Maths

Can you count in 2's, 5's and 10's the coins in a grownups purse, pocket or penny jar.

Get permission first before you do this.

How much do you have of each coin? How much more would you need to make it up to the nearest £1?



Construction

Design and make a bridge. What construction material will be best, why did you choose this. What type of bridge will you make?

Can you make one with an arch. Label your design sheet and then build your bridge.



Be as creative as you can.

Writing

Choose a sea animal to write a description about. Think about what adjectives you can use and put these into clear sentences. Year 2 can you write an expanded noun phrase?

E.g

A large, green sea turtle has a tear drop shaped shell.

Junk Modelling

Make a boat. What will you need to make one? How will you put this together?

Can you test it on water when you have made it to see if it floats? If it sank, why did it do this?

Creative

Can you draw or paint a river? What features will need to add. Look carefully at what you can see.



Have a go at making your own playdough. Here is a recipe.

You will need:-

- 2 cups of plain flour
- 1 cup of salt
- 1 tablespoon of oil
- ½ to 1 cup of water
- Food colouring.

Mix the flour and salt together in a bowl. In a jug mix the oil, water and food colouring together, add this to your flour and salt. Mix until a firm dough. You ready to play. Why not make a sea creature?
