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What we've done this week

Lively Ladybirds: This week we have read the story of Dear Zoo, we have focused on lions and camels and thought about adjectives to describe them both. We have also been designers and made some special cards for our Mummies.

Curious Caterpillars: This week we have been helping Mr Mouse to identify his new neighbour from the pictures that he sent us. We have learnt all about lions and found out lots of interesting facts

Brilliant Butterflies: This week we have been doing lots of art work. We have been experimenting with mixing different shades of green, we have done observational drawings of leaves and tested out different techniques using water colours.

Swooping Starlings: The class have settled back quickly and this week they have amazed me with their use of the high level vocabulary we have been learning - patients, suggest, clarify, brief and putrid.
