1	Improper use of drill	Group	<ul> <li>Inform person using the hand drill of how to operate it safely</li> <li>Gloves need to be worn</li> <li>First aiders and first aid kit close by.</li> <li>Tools counted in and out each session.</li> <li>One to one supervision for early years children.</li> <li>Use in designated area for tools</li> <li>Remind others in area to stay clear of tools.</li> <li>Keep in cover when not in use and store in tool bag.</li> </ul>	2	1	2

3	Improper use of bow saw	Group	<ul> <li>Inform person using bow saw of tool talk (see hand book).</li> <li>No glove needed on hand using tool, glove on non-sawing hand.</li> <li>First aiders and first aid kit close by.</li> <li>Tools counted in and out each session.</li> <li>One to one supervision for early years children.</li> <li>Ensure safety of site if using outside of designated tool use area.</li> <li>If sawing branches from a tree ensure no one or property will be hurt or damaged when it falls.</li> <li>Remind others in area to stay clear of tools.</li> <li>Keep blade cover on when not in use and store in tool bag.</li> </ul>	2	2	4
4	Improper use of knives and potato peelers.	Group	<ul> <li>Inform person using knives/peelers of tool talk (see hand book).</li> <li>Correct use to be demonstrated by forest school leader.</li> <li>Whittling knives to be blunt ended and tools to be checked before and after use for signs of damage / wear.</li> <li>No glove needed on hand using tool, glove on non-knife hand.</li> <li>First aiders and first aid kit close by.</li> <li>Knives stored in a locked secure container, numbered and counted in and out at each session.</li> <li>Use in designated area for tools.</li> <li>Keep in cover when not in use and store in tool bag.</li> <li>Remind others in vicinity to stay clear of tools.</li> </ul>	2	2	4
5	Improper use of gardening tools. (spade, fork, hoe etc.)	Group	<ul> <li>Inform person using tool how to use safely (two arms and a tool length away)</li> <li>Wear gloves on both hands .</li> <li>First aiders and first aid kit close by.</li> <li>Tools counted in and out each session.</li> <li>One to one supervision for early years children.</li> <li>Use in designated area for tools.</li> <li>Keep in cover when not in use and store in tool bag.</li> <li>Remind others in vicinity to stay clear of tools.</li> </ul>	2	1	2
6	Improper use of mallet	Group	<ul> <li>Inform person using mallet of tool talk (see hand book)</li> <li>No glove needed</li> <li>First aiders and first aid kit close by.</li> <li>Tools counted in and out each session.</li> <li>One to one supervision for early years children.</li> <li>Keep in cover when not in use and store in tool bag.</li> </ul>	2	1	2

7	Improper use of loppers	Group	<ul> <li>Inform person using loppers of tool talk (see hand book).</li> <li>No glove needed, both hand will be on tool.</li> <li>First aiders and first aid kit close by.</li> <li>Tools counted in and out each session.</li> <li>One to one supervision for early years children.</li> <li>Keep in cover when not in use and store in tool bag.</li> <li>Remind others in vicinity to stay clear of tools.</li> <li>If sawing branches from a tree ensure no one or property will be hurt/damaged when it falls.</li> </ul>	2	2	4
8	Improper use of Hot Glue Gun	Group	<ul> <li>Inform person using glue gun to use a safe distance away. (zone off area of classroom)</li> <li>Demonstrate to user correct technique.</li> <li>First aiders and first aid kit close by.</li> <li>Users to wear thick gloves during gluing process.</li> <li>One to one supervision for all children.</li> <li>Staff to check any glued items are cooled before giving to children.</li> </ul>	2	2	4
9	Improper use of Kelly Kettle	Group	<ul> <li>Follow risk assessment for open fires.</li> <li>Stay with Kelly Kettle at all times.</li> <li>Ensure it is on a sturdy level nonflammable base (it has a high center of gravity).</li> <li>Feed flames through chimney.</li> <li>Use fire safety gloves to remove base.</li> <li>Have air hole opposite side to spout.</li> <li>Do not leave cork spout in while heating water.</li> <li>Keep spout away from you to avoid splashes.</li> </ul>	2	2	4
10	Improper use of Strap Line.	Group	<ul> <li>Strap line to be installed and tested by competent staff member.</li> <li>Strap Line to be installed no higher than 50cm from the ground. Area to be checked for debris that may cause damage if users fall.</li> <li>Ensure users are wearing sensible flat footwear.</li> <li>Demonstrate correct use. Users must not step over the strap after leaving.</li> <li>Those waiting to use the rope must do so in the designated area.</li> <li>Rope to be removed immediately after use or if being left out over breaks all access gates to the woodland to be locked.</li> </ul>	2	2	4

11	Open Fires / Outdoor Cooking	Group	<ul> <li>Fires to be lit in fire pit or other suitable area.</li> <li>Area checked for overhanging trees and other possible hazards.</li> <li>Only one entry/exit point to fire area.</li> <li>No running whilst fire is lit.</li> <li>Children tending fire or cooking to wear fire gauntlets.</li> <li>Clearly demarcated safe distance area.</li> <li>Plentiful supply of water to extinguish and cool fire after use.</li> <li>All equipment to be checked for fire and temperature before storing.</li> <li>Fire blanket and first aid kit available and to hand. Group informed where these will be kept during the activity.</li> <li>Dynamic risk assessment to take place throughout the activity and activity to stop if leader has any concerns.</li> <li>Leader should ensure all food is cooked correctly before allowing children to eat it.</li> </ul>	2	2	4
12	Improper use of rope		<ul> <li>If possible use brightly coloured ropes/string.</li> <li>Mark ropes/string with visible objects if needed.</li> <li>Adults to monitor locations of ropes/string and move if necessary.</li> <li>Gloves to be worn if activity involves pulling a rope.</li> <li>Adults to monitor use of rope and to control activities that involve pulling on rope</li> <li>Loose ropes to be tidied away and secured when not in use</li> <li>Groups taught to avoid putting ropes at neck height where people could walk into them</li> <li>Adults to monitor and advise where appropriate</li> </ul>	2	2	4
