Trees climbing: potential injury falling from trees with thin or weak branches.	Only trees in safe condition can be climbed. Limit the number of pupils climbing to ensure it is safe. Pupils to be briefed about the 'twice your height maximum' rule. Pupils must be supervised at all times.	All Staff On Duty at break/lunch and during active enrichment	
Pupils playing in different environment with new potential dangers: There is an increased risk of minor injury to pupils who may require immediate first aid.	Pupils with minor injuries (scratches and minor abrasions) will be treated in situ. More serious injuries will be referred to lead First Aid trained adult who will deal with as appropriate, informing a member of SLT if the injury requires parental contact or hospital treatment.
